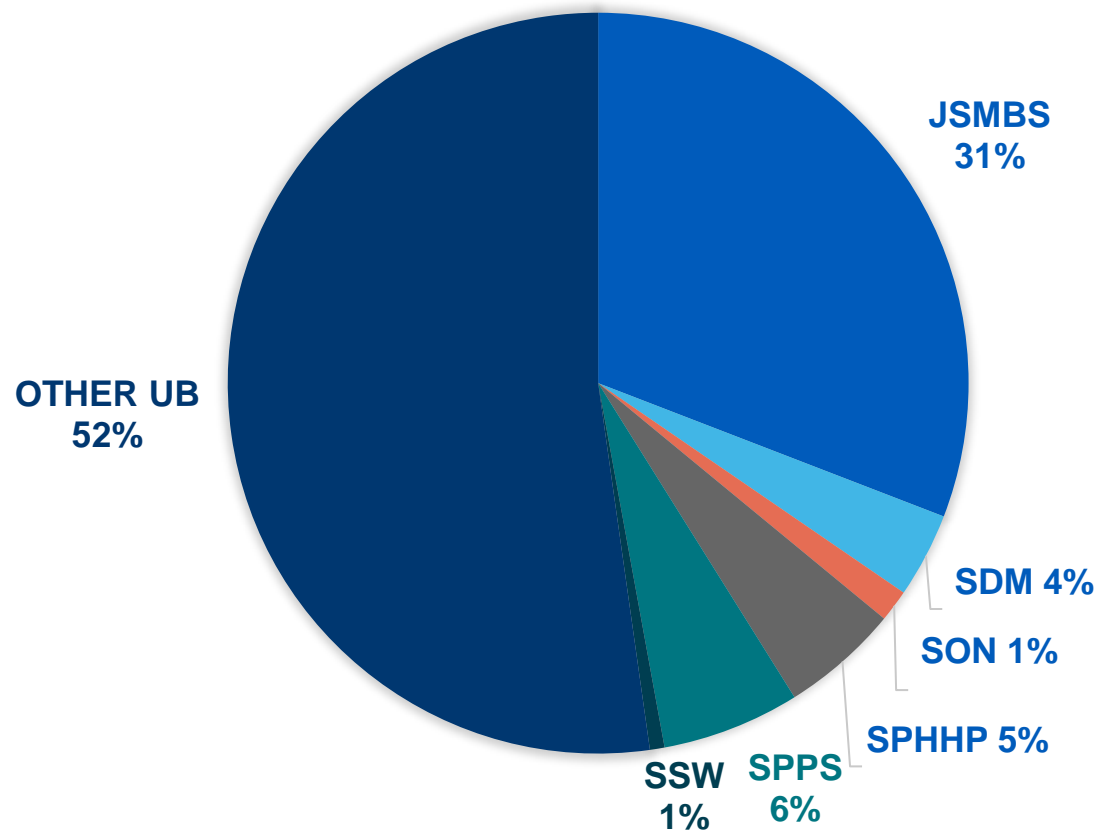

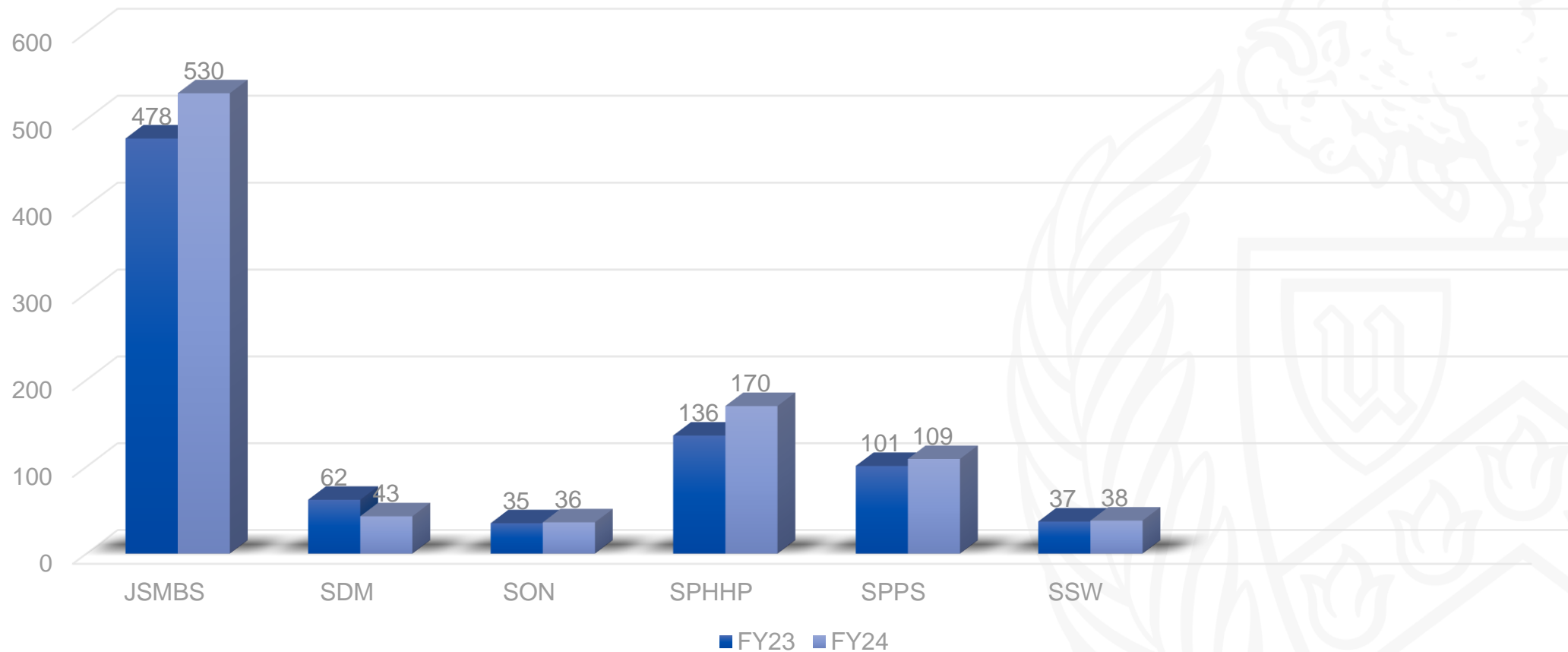

UB FY24 RESEARCH EXPENDITURES BY SCHOOL

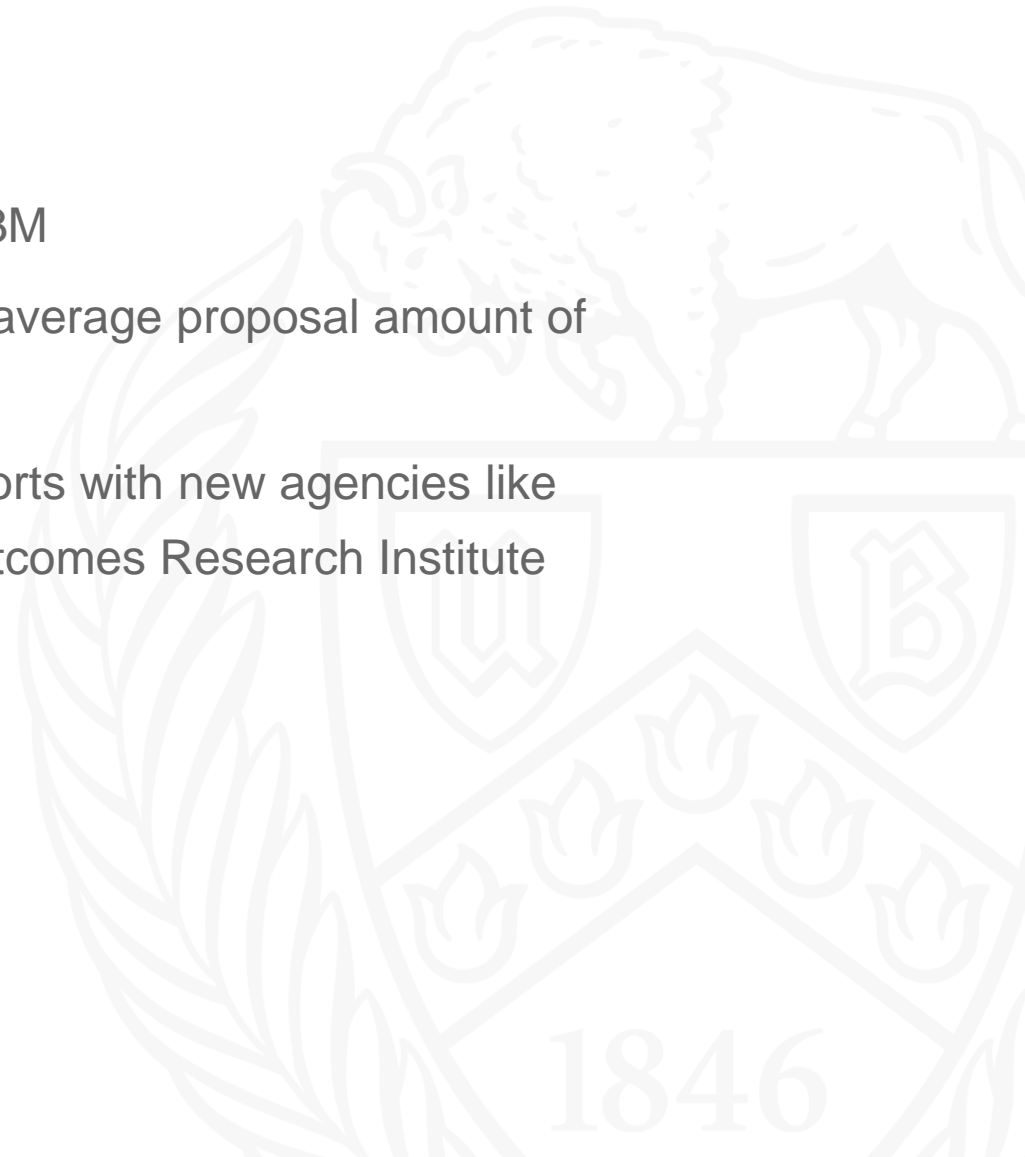


HS PROPOSAL GROWTH FY23 to FY24



MAJOR PROPOSAL PURSUIT

- In FY24 UB submitted 22 proposals over \$5M for a total of \$263M
- 13 of the 22 originate out of the health science schools with an average proposal amount of \$14.5M
- The health science schools continue to diversify our funding efforts with new agencies like ARPA-H and other unique funders like the Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI)
