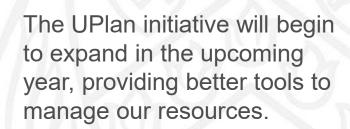


Financial Health Remains Strong

We have begun to put our cash resources to work to meet our strategic goals as New York's Flagship University.

 Internal Financial Plan balances will decrease for the first time in 5 years. Projected spend down of ~\$50M.

 6 units are projected to have started strategically spending down their cash balances.
 Overall we project the lowest rate of growth of unit cash balances in 4 years. The new state budget will provide the largest direct investment to SUNY and UB in over a decade. Legislative changes now allow us to charge differential tuition from the rest of NY for all non-resident tuition rates.

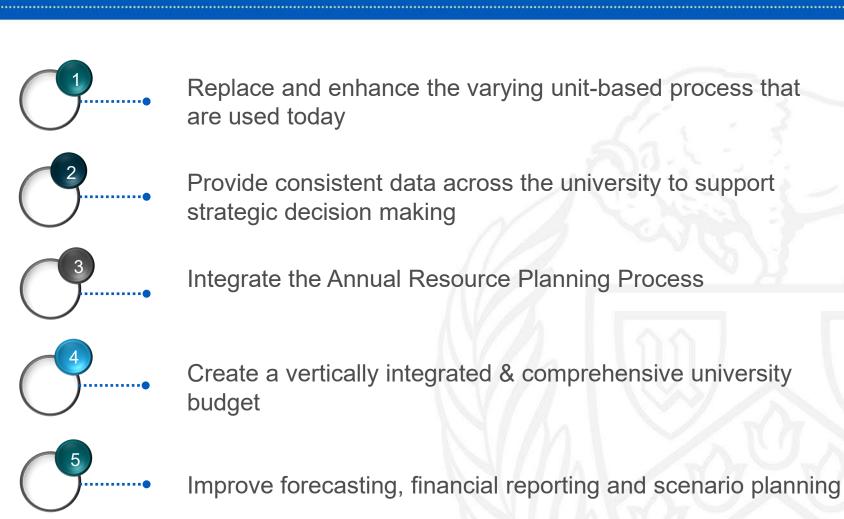




The university's initiative to develop a fully integrated, all-funds budgeting, planning and forecasting system

IFR/DIFR Fringe Policy

Support Units

- The new IFR fringe policy will be implemented for non-academic units beginning in the 2023/24 fiscal year.
- Unit targets will be the actual fringe cost from the 2022/23 fiscal year.
- Units will be reimbursed for fringe costs that exceed their target.

Academic Units

- Meetings will be held throughout the next year to evaluate the impact of this policy change to unit salary recovery policies.
- Develop consistent communication strategy highlighting benefits and optimization of changes in policy.
- Goal for implementation is fiscal year 2024/25.

Research Administrative Support

Investments requested to support research administration will be evaluated holistically across the campus over the next several months. Once complete, and there is a shared understanding of the administrative roles and responsibilities, additional unit investments may occur to support these important services across campus.

ICR Return

Will continue to evaluate. We have distributed significant amounts of ICR this year for faculty startups and markers for research administration, data management and long-term laboratory rehab. In the year ahead, we will continue to evaluate increasing the base share, which is currently at 12%.



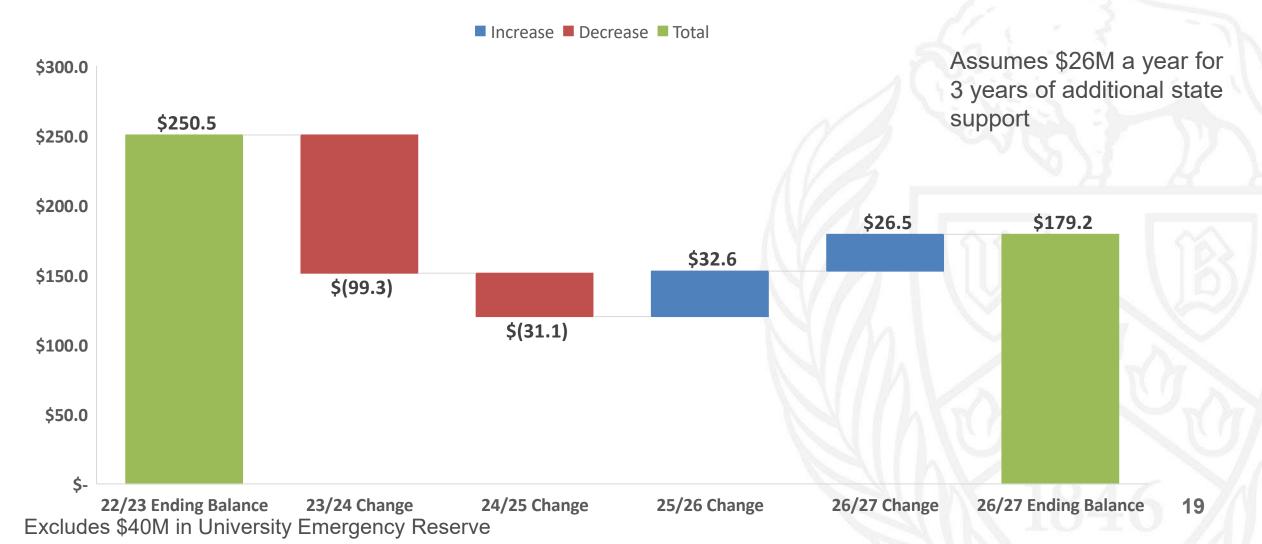
